Course Guidelines: BA-Seminar

Credit Point Requirements:

3 CP

Apart from carefully reading the set texts and actively participating in the individual sessions, you are asked to make an *Extended Contribution*. *Extended Contributions* typically consist of two parts: A first part in which you are introducing an interpretive approach, a concept or a theoretical text to the class — as the case may be. In the second part you are in charge of leading the discussion, either on your own or in cooperation with others assigned to the same text. *Extended Contributions* should last 15 minutes — make sure to time yourself beforehand in order not to exceed this limit. In addition, you are asked to prepare a handout (cum Bibliography in *MLA* format) to accompany your contribution.

Credit Point Requirements:

6 CP

Apart from carefully reading the set texts and actively participating in the individual sessions, you are asked to hand in an essay conforming to the requirements outlined in the *Study Guide Literature*. The essay should be between 4000 and 5000 words in length and must be handed in before the deadline (see below or cf. program). The thesis together with a first paragraph should be briefly discussed with me before handing it in. Grading will be based in particular on an assessment of the following five criteria:

- Argument Logic and Content
- Quality and Extent of Criticism Considered
- Thesis Statement and Essay Structure
- Language
- Formal Aspects

When you hand in your paper, do not forget to add a signed *Selbständigkeitserklärung*. Please hand in a hard copy as well as an electronic version to both Prof. Heusser and Michelle Dreiding and send the latter as follows: surname-seminar title (short)-title of paper (short).doc. Avoid mutated vowels (*Umlaute*). Example: Mueller-Metafiction-Sterne.doc. Do not send the title page as a separate file. Please note that plagiarism is illegal, and that you cannot get credit for the course if you fail to acknowledge your sources appropriately.

Please note that the maximum number of missed classes is two. Papers can be revised once. 3 CP performances are not graded – 6 CP papers are graded.
