

7 February to 18 May 2025

Virginia Woolf's novel "Mrs Dalloway", first published in 1925, is one of the most important novels of the modernist period. In it, she depicts a single day in June in the lives of all those who come into contact with Clarissa Dalloway, a London society lady and her doubleganger, Septimus Smith, a traumatised war veteran. With changing narrative perspectives and an experimental plot structure, Woolf creates a complex social panorama of post-war London. She writes about transience and the joy of living each moment, about mental health and social constraints – and about the beauty of life.

The second part of the exhibition engages with the biography, the personal and social networks, and the celebrity status of Virginia Woolf as well as her manifesto "A Room of One's Own", a crucial text for feminist thinking until this day.



