Session I: theories

In this session, the invited experts Vikki Bell (Goldsmiths), Katrin Meyer (UZH), Yuderkis Espinosa (GLEFAS) and Tania Sordo Ruz (Grupo de Estudios Feministas - UC3M) will give an overview of their theoretical perspectives on today's context regarding gender studies, feminist theories and decolonial feminisms. They will also refer to the multiple ways in which feminisms contest local, national and global systems of oppression and injustice. The participants will address these theories and approaches from a critical perspective and on the basis of previously provided reading material.

Session III: experiences

In this session, the invited experts Sayak Valencia (El Colegio de la Frontera Norte), Marisa Ruiz Trejo (UNACH) and Carolina Caycedo (artist) will talk about how feminist theories and practices have an impact not only on their academic and artistic work and routine, but also on society at large. They will discuss how theories, practices and experiences intersect and feed one another.
