Movetia Teaching Assistant Programme – General Information

A stay as a language assistant is an ideal way to:

- Teach your native language at host schools abroad
- Improve your foreign language skills
- Gain valuable professional experience
- Immerse yourself in a new culture and language

Each stay lasts between six and twelve months.

Salary:

- Language assistants receive a monthly salary, which varies depending on the host country.
- Funding from Movetia: CHF 380.00 per month

Movetia Teaching Assistant Programme – General Information

Language Assistantships are possible in:

- United Kingdom
- France
- Spain
- Germany
- Austria
- Belgium
- Swiss Schools Abroad: Italy, Spain, Singapore, Colombia

→ application deadline: 31.1.2025

Movetia Teaching Assistant Programme – General Information

Requirements:

- Swiss students, recent graduates, and teachers without professional experience are eligible. Teachers with up to a maximum of three years of initial professional experience are also accepted.
- Applicants must be native speakers of French, German, or Italian
- Interested individuals must have completed at least four semesters of study at a university, university of applied sciences, teacher training college, or higher vocational school.
- Additionally, a solid general education, clear expression in their native language, some basic knowledge in the field of education, and the ability to work independently with half-classes or groups are required.
- Participants should generally be between 20 (or 21) and 30 years old. In justified cases (e.g., secondary education), candidates up to 35 years old may also be considered.

Application process:

- Check the admission criteria on the Movetia website
- Read the program descriptions for the respective countries
- Interested parties apply using the digital application tool (see www.movetia.ch/sap).





Lehrdiplom – Regulations for the Stay Abroad Requirement

Six-month stay abroad (i.e. 26 weeks – i.e. 182 days – with max. one interruption) **before** being allowed to book the module *Fachdidaktik I*.

The stay abroad must take place after the *Matura*, in a region in which English is the first language of a majority of inhabitants (see list on ES website). This requirement can be waived if:

- the candidate spent a full academic year at an English-language school in a predominantly English-speaking region after the age of 15 (e.g. at a US high school);
- one's entire schooling until at least the age of 12 took place in English-language schools in predominantly English-speaking regions.

There are no rules regarding what students have to do during their stay abroad. You can study, work, travel, etc. Students are expected to **be able to submit written proof** of their stay abroad (e.g. flight tickets, certificates of enrollment and/or employment, etc.). **Note:** Flight tickets alone do not constitute proof!

Requirements

- enrolled at UZH when applying and during exchange
- min. 2 semesters at UZH completed before leaving for exchange (for BA students)
- Learning Agreement (UZH Global Student Experience Office via Mobility Online)
- Anerkennungsvereinbarung (ES → Studiendekanat)

Note: Please check the Mobility Online search platform to see the available exchange places for HS25/FS26. You can apply until January 15, there is no first come first served!

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Study Abroad: Application Process, Deadlines & Accreditation

Bachelor (if you want to complete the degree in six semesters):

- not during first two semesters → only **after successful completion of foundation studies**
- **if one year: semesters 3 & 4**
- **if one term: ideally semester 5, but 3-5 all possible**
- the final semester is not ideal for a stay abroad

Master (if you want to complete the degree in four semesters):

- **ideally semester 2 or 3, but semester 1 is also no problem**
- the final semester is not ideal for a stay abroad

HOWEVER: be aware that sometimes, course choices may change and that not all courses can be accredited the way you would like them to be accredited.

Study Abroad: Application Process, Deadlines & Accreditation

Option 1: Min. 1 ES-only place (+ 0-2 UZH «Diverse» or worldwide places)

Examples:

1. London, 2. Lancaster, 3. Vienna (all ES-only places)

1. Sydney, 2. Lancaster, 3. Durham (1 worldwide, 1 ES-only place, 1 «Diverse»)

Deadline: January 15

- Always put your 1st choice on Place 1!
- Applications via Mobility Online (opens on November 1)
- Follow the guidelines on Mobility Online and the ES website!
- Mention your academic interests in your motivational letter and also mention at least 3 courses that you would be interested in and explain why!
- ES specific documents: Application Form and 3 Referee Reports
→ digital forms available from November 1, please check the English Department Stay Abroad website

Study Abroad: Application Process, Deadlines & Accreditation

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Examples:

1. Sydney, 2. Lancaster, 3. Durham (1 worldwide, 1 ES-only place, 1 «Diverse»)

Financial support for SEMP: fees at guest university waived + grant*: CHF 1330.- for a trimester (2-3 months) and CHF 1900.- for a semester (3+ months)

(*Mobility grants cannot be guaranteed, grant sum may vary!)

Option 2: Only UZH «Diverse» and/or worldwide places

Deadlines: see Global Student Experience website (usually January 15, subject to change)

- Always put your 1st choice on Place 1!
- Applications via Mobility Online (opens on November 1)
- Follow the guidelines on Mobility Online!
- Financial support: fees at guest university waived, some grants available (see <https://www.int.uzh.ch/de/out/finance.html>)

Study Abroad: Application Process, Deadlines & Accreditation

- Before you go abroad, you must contact the study abroad coordinator and discuss your course choices to make sure they get accredited.
- Course choices may change once you arrive at the partner university
→ contact study abroad coordinator again to discuss changes
- Before you go abroad, you need to sign
 - an Anerkennungsvereinbarung (filled out by the study abroad coordinator)
 - and for SEMP places also a Learning Agreement
- no accreditation without prior Anerkennungsvereinbarung!
- compulsory courses should be completed at the UZH ES and not abroad
- in many cases: credit points from abroad must be converted, ask the study abroad coordinator for details
- upon return: submit original transcripts & all written work to studyabroad@es.uzh.ch

Further Stay Abroad Options

Teaching Abroad – USA: Amity Intern Program (cf. <https://amity.org/>)

Entry Requirements

- be currently enrolled at a university OR have graduated no more than 12 months before the start
- have a career goal in education
- proficiency in English – and be enthusiastic about sharing their culture and native language

Interns:

- are assigned to a supervising teacher
- work in school for approximately 32 hours a week (excludes occasional special events)
- play a flexible role in the classroom (e.g. assisting teacher, developing materials, etc.)
- **Note:** Interns stay with a host family (free room and board) + monthly stipend of \$200

Further Stay Abroad Options

Fulbright-Swiss Foreign Student and Visiting Scholar Program, USA

Entry Requirements

- Swiss citizenship
- Undergraduate degree from a University or University of Applied Sciences and Arts completed by summer 2024.
- English proficiency with a TOEFL Internet-based iBT score of 100 or higher.

Duration of stay: 4-10 months, not renewable

Grant sum: ca. \$20,000, depending on the number of finalists and on the availability of funds

Application Deadline: August 2024 for an exchange in summer 2025

Stay Abroad Portfolio & Research-based Report

Stay Abroad Portfolio (Bachelor Module) and Stay Abroad: Research-Based Report (Master Module)

- Students who have spent six or more weeks within one year and with max. one interruption (i.e. min. 42 days) in the same particular Anglophone region (region = usually not a whole country) can choose to compile a stay abroad portfolio (BA) or a research-based report (MA) and earn 3 ECTS.
- If you have already received credit points in English for a stay abroad or studying abroad (e.g. exchange semester, credited summer school, credited internship, regular studies in another country, etc.), it does NOT count as a possible stay abroad for the portfolio/report.
- **Before you book the module** you should send an outline to the study abroad coordinator and discuss your idea for the portfolio/report
- The portfolio must be **handed in no later than 12 months after the end of the stay abroad**
- You can find these modules in the course catalog in the module group Other Curricular modules
- **Submission deadlines: Fall semester: November 1 / Spring semester: May 1**
